BOOK CLUB: Next meeting Wednesday 26thApril 7.30pm to discuss The Shoes of the Fisherman by Morris West All welcome.

Today we recall the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and we hear again the story of the Passion. But as we stand in church waving our palms and reading our Mass books or Missalettes, we have to be aware that we are doing more than just re-reading a two thousand year old story. What point is there in simply remembering a sequence of events? There is only a point in remembering Jesus' Passion if it truly impacts on our twenty first century lives. We don't need to have been around at the time to imagine how it must have felt to be a part of the crowd that greeted Jesus as he rode into Jerusalem. We know what it's like to be swept along with a crowd. We know how we can be brave as part of a crowd... infallible even. We remember the crowd that supported lesus so enthusiastically at the beginning of the week and how it mysteriously melted away by the end, to be replaced by a different crowd shouting for his crucifixion. Are we any better than those original supporters? Can we stand up for Jesus as individuals when the going gets tough? We remember Jesus' journey from Palm Sunday to Good Friday. We remember that it's a journey he made with no hint of compromise. How easy it would have been for Jesus to have bypassed Jerusalem altogether, but what would have been the point of that for us two thousand years on. There is no room in Christianity for compromise. We remember the death of lesus as a supreme act of love. Jesus taught that we were worth all that pain and suffering. Do we leave the church today simply to catch up with our Facebook accounts and enjoy our Sunday lunch, or do we consider how we should live our lives from this day on knowing that Jesus considered us worth his ultimate sacrifice?

HOLY WEEK

The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper

The night before Jesus died he had supper with his closest friends, the Apostles, the Last Supper. This is the same day we recall the beginnings of the Priesthood and the Institution of the Eucharist. We will come together at St Joseph's on Thursday evening to celebrate this Mass and to remember this gathering of Jesus with his friends and what he asked of them, as well as remembering how he gave Himself to the world.

Good Friday Afternoon

The main service for all Catholic Churches on Good Friday is the afternoon Service, usually at 3pm when we commemorate the Passion and Death of the Lord. It is the only day we do not celebrate Mass. We encourage you to come along as we have the opportunity to take part in the Veneration of the Cross on which Jesus died.

The Watching

It is customary after the Mass on Holy Thursday that we have the time of "Watching", a time of prayer from the end of Mass until 10pm, when we are asked to spend time in prayer, remembering the prayer and the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane that Jesus endured during his final hours. Please consider giving time to this quiet prayer on Thursday Evening. While some might wish to remain in Church quietly after Mass, others could go home after Mass, have a cup of tea or coffee and then come back for the watching!

Day of Fasting and Abstinence

Good Friday is Day of Fasting and Abstinence. Fasting means that the amount of food we eat is considerably reduced, applicable for all aged 18-59. Abstinence means that everyone over 14 years give up a particular kind of food or drink or form of amusement (e.g. we do not usually eat meat on Good Friday as well as refraining from other 'luxuries' that day). It is a solemn day and this should affect the things we do and the way we behave.

Easter Vigil

The Easter Vigil is considered to be the most important Mass in the Church's year, so we do ask you to try and come along on Saturday evening to St Joseph's for the Mass. It begins with a Blessing of Fire and blessing of the new Easter Candle, followed by a Vigil of Readings and Prayers before the Mass of the Resurrection, during which we rejoice at the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. If you can, come along to this Mass at 7pm on Saturday evening.

Statement on Illegal Migration Bill

The Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees, Bishop Paul McAleenan, has commented on the government's Illegal Migration Bill:

"Everyone who makes a dangerous journey across the Channel to build a better life here has a name, a face, and a story.

"People are driven from their homes by poverty, conflict, persecution, natural disasters, or other factors that prevent their flourishing. Many have links to the UK or family members already living here. Yet, far too often, there are no safe routes open to them.

"While we all wish to end dangerous Channel crossings, this new legislation treats migrants and refugees as a problem to be solved rather than brothers and sisters towards whom we have responsibilities. Establishing more safe routes and genuinely understanding people's individual circumstances are essential to meeting these.

"As Christians we call for the human person, made in the image and likeness of God, to be put at the heart of public policy."

"Serving those who have served us well" The Diocesan Sick and Retired Priests' Collection will be taken on the weekend of 15th and 16th April 2023, and the Fund will remain open until 5th May for anyone who might like to make further or individual donations. This collection goes to support our Sick and Retired Priests who have served our diocese over many years and we wish to make sure that this Fund is also there for future retired priests. Recent years have been very difficult and income has drastically dropped.
