St Joseph's is very short of volunteers for the mundane tasks of maintaining a clean, tidy, environment, both outside and inside the church.

This will probably be very obvious especially this weekend as one of our usual volunteers, who undertakes a huge amount of work behind the scenes has been confined to bed for the week with covid and therefore unable to do the essentials.

If we had some more willing hands it would ease the burden on the few and ensure illness isn't always the barrier to a clean and tidy setting!! Please give volunteering a thought!!

The Sunday readings are not randomly picked, but are carefully chosen so that the First reading and the Gospel link together in the same theme: the Gospel builds on the first reading; the New Testament fulfilling the Old and the responsorial psalm reflects the theme.

Today's Psalm, which is also a response to the theme of reading and Gospel, sets out the message "Shout for joy to the Lord all the earth". In the first reading Isaiah describes Jerusalem, God's people as a nursing mother healing our sickness and suffering and becoming the compassionate heart of the whole world. And in the gospel Jesus sends out the 72 disciples with the same message "heal the sick and bring the message of peace to all".

We are God's chosen people, not because we are better than anybody else but because we have been chosen to serve the world. The idea of a chosen race is a dangerous one unless we remember it to mean we are chosen as servants for all of our neighbours, no matter what their race religion or creed.

It is not just the 12 apostles who are sent out, but the whole body of believers, Mission is the result of our baptism, and it is what being a Christian is all about.

Sadly the church today is not recognised by many as an instrument of peace, service and compassion to all, for many it represents the source of evils, of conflicts and war. We know that God sent His son into the world to save it, not to condemn and so we must remember we are a 'servant church' and we need to approach others with respect, we serve their needs, we welcome them and through example and dialogue we may just convert a non believer into a follower of Christ – we do not set out to convert but to serve – "Rejoice not that spirits submit to you. Rejoice rather that your names are written in Heaven"

We may never arrive at the point of converting someone, but the foundation for our Catholic Christian lives is one of service, welcome and compassion - when we fulfil this duty then our names are written down in heaven. Remember the beatitudes "blessed be the peacemakers for they shall become sons and daughters of God".

Through our baptism and confirmation God empowers us to become His peacemakers throughout the world: a commitment we renew with every Holy Communion when we make contact with the Risen Lord present in the Bread of Life. It is the Lord's work we are doing, so be confident that miracles will happen and like the 72 we will find evils dissolve in the presence of our love, let us truly be instruments of peace and reconciliation.

A Chinese Proverb which reflects this beautifully is: Where there is respect in the heart: there is beauty in the person; where there is beauty in the person there is harmony in the home. Where there is harmony in the home there is order in the nation where there is order in the nation there is peace in the world.

Bishop Paul McAleenan who has special responsibility for migrants and is Chair of the Office for Migration Policy at the Catholic Bishops' Conference made this statement on June 14th 2022: The UK's plans to forcibly deport to Rwanda some of those seeking refuge in our country is shamefully illustrative of what Pope Francis has called the 'loss of that sense of responsibility for our brothers and sisters on which every civil society is based'. The plan is presented as a humanitarian response to combat people trafficking and smuggling yet the result will compound the suffering of those who are already victims. Crime is defeated by confronting the perpetrators not by punishing victims. This scheme will increase the difficulties of those hoping for a new beginning, and it does nothing to address the problems which cause people to flee their homes. Migration is a complex issue, but it is not resolved by delegating our roles and responsibilities to other countries. Our starting point should be the innate dignity of every person, created in the image and likeness of God. Our Christian faith demands that we respond generously to asylum seekers whose dignity must be protected and upheld. Whether or not the flight to Rwanda takes off today we are now in a new situation. With greater force we insist that asylum seekers are not commodities for profit, nor are they problems to be rejected and deported by government. Instead we should be guided by the four verbs provided by Pope Francis in our approach to migrants and refugees, 'Welcome, protect, promote and integrate'.
