THE 46th ANNUAL BLESSED JOHN INGRAM WALK SUNDAY 22nd JULY The Annual Blessed John Ingram Walk takes place this year on <u>Sunday 22nd July</u>, starting in Newcastle and concluding near the place of his martyrdom on Gateshead High Street. The Walk begins near the site of the prison, where

Blessed John Ingram was held , at St Andrew's Anglican Church, Newgate Street, Newcastle. We gather there for 2.30 pm, and we have a short prayer service at 2.45 pm.

We then take a leisurely walk down through the Big Market and across the Swing Bridge, walking up to Gateshead High Street, and assembling at the site of St Edmund's Chapel (now called Holy Trinity) located at the bottom of Jackson Street. This is the exact location where our Priest Martyr was executed. There we will have an Ecumenical Service, followed by refreshments. If you would like to take part without doing the Walk, you should assemble at St Edmund's at 3.30 pm. As our Partnership of Gateshead parishes carries his name, we hope more of us will come along to commemorate his sacrifice for the Catholic faith on 26th July 1594 at the age of 29 years. He had trained in the English College in Rome and served as a priest in Scotland before being arrested in Northumberland. Simply being present as a Catholic priest in Elizabethan England was high treason punishable by death. John was tortured in the Tower of London, but refused to betray the people who had helped him in his ministry, and was eventually condemned to death at the Durham Assizes.

By honouring his sacrifice, we seek the help of his intercession in heaven, so that we will have the same courage and determination as missionary disciples to witness to our Catholic faith here in Gateshead.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Hermits lived on Mount Carmel near the Fountain of Elijah in northern Israel in the 12th century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. By the 13th century they became known as "Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel." They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honour of Mary. In 1726, it became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary. Their great saints and theologians have promoted devotion to her and often championed the mystery of her Immaculate Conception.

Saint Teresa of Avila called Carmel "the Order of the Virgin." Saint John of the Cross credited Mary with saving him from drowning as a child, leading him to Carmel, and helping him escape from prison. Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus believed that Mary cured her from illness. On her First Communion day, Thérèse dedicated her life to Mary. During the last days of her life she frequently spoke of Mary.

There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary's own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way.
