Civil Changes to Getting Married

On 4th May, the civil paperwork needed to get married changes ac-cording to The Civil Partnerships, Marriages and Deaths (Registration etc.) Act 2019. You no longer need a Blue Certificate, but you do need a Marriage Schedule from the Registrar which must then be handed to the person leading your wedding. I encourage all those who are getting married this year to make contact with the staff at the Register Office to make sure your paperwork is complete and correct as soon as possible. If the paperwork is not complete the wedding cannot go ahead.
