**THE NORTH EAST HOMELESS CONFERENCE** will be held in the church hall on Friday 26th May 2017, from 10am -4pm. Christians from across the North East will gather to discuss practical solutions to the housing need and homelessness. There will also be a series of workshops and a chance to speak to other Christians and faith based organisations involved in homelessness in the region. Senior clergy and housing experts will address the meeting and there will be a chance for questions and networking. 1,317 households were accepted as homeless and in priority need of accommodation by local authorities in the North East during 2016. 57,678 people were on local authority waiting lists for housing during the same period. Housing Justice, an ecumenical Christian based homeless charity (formerly the Catholic Housing Aid Society) and Depaul UK will host the event. Entry is free and lunch is provided. ## Saint Rita of Cascia

(1381 – May 22, 1457)

Like Elizabeth Ann Seton, Rita of Cascia was a wife, mother, widow, and member of a religious community. Her holiness was reflected in each phase of her life.

Born at Roccaporena in central Italy, Rita wanted to become a nun but was pressured at a young age into marrying a harsh and cruel man. During her 18year marriage, she bore and raised two sons. After her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons had died, Rita tried to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Unsuccessful at first because she was a widow, Rita eventually succeeded.

Over the years, her austerity, prayerfulness, and charity became legendary. When she developed wounds on her forehead, people quickly associated them with the wounds from Christ's crown of thorns. She meditated frequently on Christ's passion. Her care for the sick nuns was especially loving. She also counselled lay people who came to her monastery.

Beatified in 1626, Rita was not canonized until 1900. She has acquired the reputation, together with Saint Jude, as a saint of impossible cases. Many people visit her tomb each year.
