St Joseph's Security Plea

We desperately need to improve the security around the Church and Presbytery grounds, especially after the last few weeks which have seen vandalism to the hall doors, several people asked to vacate the premises as they were caught in the act of urinating on the church steps, the CCTV captured a young woman defecating in front of the church during daylight hours, numerous alcoholics, drug addicts and young people have been asked to leave as they sit swearing, drinking, injecting and littering the grounds, three homeless people spent three nights sleeping on the doorstep despite having been offered help from the local council. Although at the minute this behaviour has not gone beyond being anti-social, the fear is it could escalate into something more sinister and dangerous. If you can help towards this fund please mark your donations as 'Security'. Securing the gate to the street is going to cost £400 and we need to improve the gates to the car park and the fencing/railings around the grounds as well as updating and extending the CCTV system.

This urgent job will be very expensive, every penny counts!
