The Open Door Event will take place on a Wednesday

"When I Awake Lord I Shall Be Filled With Your Glory"

David, the shepherd king of Israel, was a poet and a musician. He wrote the Psalms, the hymn book of the Jewish Temple. The responsorial Psalm today is a beautiful response to the first reading, the belief in the resurrection of the body. David says death is only sleeping; "When I awake, Lord I shall be filled with Your glory"

The New Testament too refers to death as being asleep. It is a fitting theme for November, the month of the Faithful Departed: "those who sleep in Christ and have gone before us marked with the sign of Faith"

The Book of Maccabees, our first reading, was written at least 50 years before Christ; it shows that belief in a bodily resurrection is pre-Christian, a faith which gave courage to the seven Jewish brothers to face death rather than deny their faith.

Resurrection was much discussed in Jesus' day; the Sadducees denied it, they were Priestly Aristocratic families who ridiculed the whole idea of resurrection by asking Jesus what happens to the woman after death who had been widowed seven times and buried seven husbands; whose wife is she in the life to come? Our Lord replied that after death there is no physical union of marriage since the risen body is not flesh and blood but a new creation. It is also immortal; therefore no-one dies and so there is no need for procreation. He reminded them that Moses, in the book of Genesis, taught that death was not God's doing, He creates life not death. If after death man was only a disembodied spirit he would not be fully alive. In God's plan the whole person; body and soul is immortal and incorruptible. It is an impoverished view of the Creator to teach that only the soul survives death. We are fully human in Heaven, body and soul, not disembodied spirits.

With this vision of Heaven the church opens the month of The Faithful Departed with the feast of All saints. The more we think of the Glory that awaits us, the more we will pray for those who have gone before us. The teaching of Purgatory is very consoling; that after death we may still be on our journey to Heaven. It is also very reasonable; we ought to be ready at death for immediate glory - but are we?

One minute after death I am the same person as a minute before, with the same regrets and unfinished business; debts unpaid, promises unfulfilled; duties neglected; hurts unhealed; broken friendships not mended. With these things on my mind I cannot be truly happy, I am not ready for the vision of God. My pilgrimage of faith home to God's house is still ongoing, however my journey to Heaven is now certain; there is no fear or anxiety or pain in purgatory. I am safe, peaceful and full of joy; but I rely on the prayers of those I loved on earth to help me finish my journey.

We who will follow them can help them in the great Communion of Saints; the family of God.

Always speak kindly of the dead; tell them we forgive them, ask them to forgive us.

In the days of Catholic England when all were united to the Bishop of Rome, the successor of St Peter, all over our country chapels were built as "Holy Souls Chapels" where the monks chanted daily the Requiem Mass and the Office of the dead, they were known as 'Chantries' - King Henry 8th abolished them.

St John Henry Newman wrote "The Dream of Gerontius" - Gerontius is Latin for old man. It is the story of Gerontius dying: facing judgement and going to Purgatory. This epic poem was set to music by Sir Edward Elgar, and includes Newman's hymn "Praise to the Holiest in the Height" and ends with the song of Gerontius Guardian Angel leading him to Purgatory. It is thoroughly Catholic in its teaching of death:

Judgement, purgatory, prayers for the dead and the vision of God.

We Pray for all the departed that they rest in peace and rise in glory!

For people who become isolated because of ill health, disability or social disadvantage, being matched with a 'Befriender' often fills a big gap. Befriending offers supportive, reliable relationships through volunteer befrienders to people who would otherwise be socially isolated.

'Rescare' is a unique nationwide charity that has been supporting families who have loved ones with a learning disability, by promoting quality and choice in care, education, and health since 1984. Families are at the centre of what we do.

Rescare's Befriending service is designed to help people who are experiencing feelings of loneliness and/or isolation to enable them to start to feel connected to other people in a positive way again.

What is befriending?

"The chances are we've all been affected by Loneliness, either directly or through someone close to us. We can all do more to try and make a difference and make our country a less lonely place."

The Befriending service is free offered by Rescare and delivered by fully trained volunteers. It is a chance for you to connect and enjoy chatting with someone over the phone, meet up for a cuppa or go for walk together.

Whether you'd like to speak to someone every week, or just want to talk when the need strikes, we're here to help.

Rescare has a mission to help families. Traditionally we have always had a helpline available for more information, advice and guidance in around the learning disability sector. In 2021 we launched our friendship service where you can simply talk to someone.
