

Today is the First Sunday of Advent 2021



With Advent, we beginning a new liturgical cycle and at the same time we prepare to commemorate the first coming of Christ, as described in the reading: The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and Judah. In those days, in that time, I will raise up for David a just shoot; he shall do what is right and just in the land. In those days Judah shall be safe and Jerusalem shall dwell secure; this is what they shall call her: "The Lord our justice." Jer 33:14-16.

Our time here on earth is for us a calling to embark with joyful hope for His second coming at the end of time, as we profess in the Creed: "And he shall come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end." The

definitive and glorious coming of Our Lord is described with cosmic events in today's Gospel: "Jesus said to his disciples: "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." Lk 21:25-28.

The Advent season presents to us an occasion to a renewed encounter with Our Lord Jesus Christ, who keeps on coming to meet us in His Word, in the Eucharist, and in our brothers. It is a calling; to lift our soul to the Lord (cfr. Responsorial

Psalm): to "increase and abound in love for one another and for all", "to strengthen your hearts, to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones." (2nd Reading, 1 Thes 3:12-4:2), freeing our soul from vices, worldly concerns and sensual pleasures, we prepare ourselves for His Second Coming, whose day nor hour, we do not know: "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap." Lk 21: 34-36

Dear brethren in Christ, let us heed Our Lord's call to vigilance, purity and holiness, "as we wait with joyful hope the coming of Our Savior, Jesus Christ." Mother Mary, help us!

"Honouring Sunday"

Following their November Meeting, the Bishops of England & Wales have issued a new document entitled "Honouring Sunday" in which they are asking every Catholic to think about how special Sunday is, as a day we set aside for celebrating the Eucharist together at Mass.

"The Sunday Eucharist is a gift; as God's holy people we are called to praise and thank God in the most sublime way possible. When the Church speaks of the Sunday obligation, it reminds us that attending Mass is a

personal response to the selfless offering of Christ's love. At this time, we recognize that for some people there may be certain factors which hinder attendance at Sunday Mass. The pandemic is clearly not over. The risk of infection is still present. For some, there is legitimate

fear in gathering together. As your bishops, we recognize that these prevailing circumstances suggest that not everyone is yet in the position to fulfill the absolute duty to attend freely Sunday Mass. We now encourage all Catholics to look again at the patterns which they have formed in recent months with regard to

going to Mass on Sundays. This would include consideration and reflection about what we might do ('be doing') on Sundays, such as sports or shopping, or other

leisure and social activities. This review, and the decisions which arise from it, fall to every Catholic and we trust this will be done with honesty, motivated by a real love for the Lord whom we encounter in the Mass Full document available on <u>www.cbcew.org.uk</u>

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a votive Mass in honour of Our Lady during the season of Advent. It takes its name from the opening words of the Introit, which comes to us from Isaiah 45:8 and has a long tradition in the Catholic Church, especially in Germany where the Masses had to begin relatively early in the morning when it was still dark due to winter-time and were said by candlelight.
