"Come Down Zacchaeus; let's go home together for a meal"

Whenever I see a sycamore tree I see Zacchaeus climbing it for a better view of Jesus passing by. It is akward for a little man in a crowd, the great advantage of a sycamore tree is its large broad leaves. Zacchaeus could see but not be seen, he could hide which was perfect for a senior tax collector working in Israel for the Roman army! These tax collectors could impose their own fees, on top of overtaxing the people and pocketing the difference. They were a hated class and always unwelcome. Zacchaeus, a senior tax collector would have had many reasons to remain hidden.

Suddenly Jesus stops beneath the tree, Zacchaeus now begins to feel embarrassed, there is a big crowd gathering, Zacchaeus needs to remain very still, but Jesus looks up, nobody can hide from Jesus. "Zacchaeous come down, I want to be a guest at your house today" Now Zacchaeus is honoured instead of feeling embarrassed; it is the crowd who is completely shocked! Zacchaeus hurries down from the tree and immediately begins to confess to Jesus, "I'm sorry for the things I've done"

This meeting between Jesus and Zacchaeus illustrates two great concerns for Luke:

First - Jesus is the compassionate and gentle saviour of all people, He excludes no-one from His friendship.

He reminds the crowd today that Zacchaeus too is a son of Abraham, he is one of us and should not be shunned; he is a welcome member of the community.

Second Luke is showing that Jesus has a commitment to social justice, to work for justice in the market place of society is to work for the Kingdom of God.

Those who, like Zacchaeus work in the world of finance make grave moral decisions; their vision needs to be based on the common good and not just competition and profits. Jesus also teaches us that we change people, not by judging them, not by making them feel guilty, but by love. "Let's go home together Zacchaeus", Zacchaeus is so overcome by love that he changed from cheating and stealing to a life of restitution and generousity. Perhaps this was the first time in his life that Zacchaeus felt genuinely loved by another human being. Until now others had despised him or used him.

We need St Luke's Jesus today; many of our own countrymen do not see this gentle, compassionate Jesus in the church. The Catholic Church is seen as an institution of law and power: concerned with obedience and religious observance rather than welcome and mercy. We must become a welcoming compassionate community of love. Jesus comes to unburden people, not to add burden to their lives. A community that does not exclude; but welcomes all; especially the broken hearted. A teaching church; with a message of human freedom, and respect for conscience; not a message of guilt and fear.

The day will come when Christ will 'stop under our tree' and call us by name "come let's go home together and have a meal", if we have lived His gentle, non-judgmental life; played our part for justice and lived with integrity and generous service to those in need; welcoming all whom we meet; inviting them to our table then the Lord will have His table ready for us - the feast of eternal life in Heaven

Rescare Befriending Service



Everyone needs other people, but not everyone has someone. For people who become isolated because of ill health, disability or social disadvantage, being matched with a 'Befriender' often fills a big gap. Befriending offers supportive, reliable relationships through volunteer befrienders to people who would otherwise be socially isolated.

'Rescare' is a unique nationwide charity that has been supporting families who have loved ones with a learning disability, by promoting quality and choice in care, education, and health since 1984. Families are at the centre of what we do.

Rescare's Befriending service is designed to help people who are experiencing feelings of loneliness and/or isolation to enable them to start to feel connected to other people in a positive way again.

What is befriending?

"The chances are we've all been affected by Loneliness, either directly or through someone close to us. We can all do more to try and make a difference and make our country a less lonely place."

The Befriending service is free offered by Rescare and delivered by fully trained volunteers. It is a chance for you to connect and enjoy chatting with someone over the phone, meet up for a cuppa or go for walk together.

Whether you'd like to speak to someone every week, or just want to talk when the need strikes, we're here to help.

Is our befriending service for you?

Rescare has a mission to help families. Traditionally we have always had a helpline available for more information, advice and guidance in around the learning disability sector. In 2021 we launched our friendship service where you can simply talk to someone.

Get in touch with us if you are:

- A parent of someone with a Learning Disability and/or Autism
- A Carer of someone with a Learning Disability and/or Autism
- An individual with a Learning Disability and/or Autism aged 18+

You don't need to be feeling lonely (though if you are, we'd like to help), and you don't need to live on your own. Sometimes it's just nice to talk.
