Please remember in your prayers all those who are sick or who have recently died. Please also pray for peace in Ukraine and for those struggling to make ends meet right now. Remember too those who have received 'A' level results recently, that their future paths are strewn with grace. Prayers also for all those who return to school this coming week, may their year be filled with happiness and friendship.

St Luke tells us, "Great crowds followed Him...."

Jesus inspired a huge popular movement in Palestine, and so it has continued down the centuries. Christianity is the world's most popular religion. People are ready to follow Jesus to the ends of the earth: inspired by the humanity of the Gospel, its idealism and concern for the sick and the poor. The church today is the greatest health provider in the world.

So what are we to make of the blunt message today? "If anyone comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children.... he cannot be my disciple" and "no one can be my disciple without giving up all he possesses" Did Jesus really say and mean that?!

He taught us to love our enemies, how now can He be asking us to hate those we love? Surely we must hate noone; we must hate the sin but love the sinner!

According to St Matthew, Jesus said "if anyone prefers father or mother to me, he is not worthy of me". We cannot be sure of Our Lord's exact words, all we can be sure of is that what Jesus did teach and what Matthew and Luke report is the radical nature of our commitment to the person of Jesus who is 'the Way, the Truth and the Life'. Truth is not neutral, there are fundamentals which cannot be compromised, there are moral absolutes:-killing the innocent; the child in the womb, stealing, lying, false reporting. There are lines we cannot cross, truths which cannot be altered no matter how much we wish they could; people of the same sex cannot get married, a man cannot have two wives or a wife two husbands.

There comes a time when a parent must say to a son or daughter:-"I disagree with what you intend to do but I still love you, you still belong, this is always your home where you were nourished in faith, and you are always welcome"

This is where we let go without ceasing to love, and it can be costly and painful, but there is a line we cannot cross - the truth is never neutral.

Our Lord taught us to pray every day that it will never come to a place where we have such a difficult choice to make "Lead us not into temptation" - means- "do not put us to the test". None of us want to be faced with such a choice where we have to let go of something or someone we love for the greater love of God, it is a kind of martyrdom.

St Thomas More could not acknowledge the king as the head of the church, his wife Alice and their daughter Margaret were allowed to visit him on condition that they try to persuade him to take the oath of the king's supremacy; "We have lost everything" they told him, "our food, our home, we are sent into exile. Just pretend to take the oath, times will change, England needs you" Thomas More hated what they were trying to do, he could not betray his faith and chose it over their pleas, but he did not cease to love them.

We pray that we will never have to face such a choice, but we know that such a moment is possible. We must prepare ourselves for the test. Our Lord tells two stories about perseverance in our commitment: the builder who couldn't finish because he had not planned his work against his resources and the soldier preparing for war. We don't want to start our Christian life and not persevere in it, we have to know our strengths and weaknesses, we ready ourselves for the contest by daily sacrifices; everyday being faithful in little things, no compromise in matters of truth and justice. We strengthen our will in case the ultimate choice comes, but we pray daily to be delivered from such a test.

The idols worshipped today are money, power and sex; they are false gods who will let us down. We become what we love, if we love Jesus above all things we become the sons and daughters of God, heirs to eternal joy in the resurrection from the dead.
