We Pray for the Repose of the Soul of Our Beloved Queen Elizabeth who has served us all with so much courage, dignity, humility and devotion throughout her 70 year reign, we pray also for her family and in particular her son Charles our new King, may he follow his mother's example and serve humbly without seeking reward or fame.

MY SON IT WAS ONLY RIGHT THAT WE SHOULD CELEBRATE AND REJOICE, BECAUSE YOUR BROTHER HERE WAS DEAD AND HAS COME TO LIFE: HE WAS LOST AND IS FOUND"

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL JESUS TELLS US THREE PARABLES ABOUT GOD SEARCHING FOR THOSE WHOSE LIVES ARE BROKEN THROUGH SIN. THE LOST COIN, THE LOST SHEEP AND THE PRODIGAL SON, WHO CAME TO HIS SENSES AND WENT BACK HOME. ANGELS IN HEAVEN REJOICE WHEN THE SINNER RETURNS HOME, AND HOME TO MOTHER CHURCH; HOME TO HER TABLE THE EUCHARIST.

The parable of the Prodigal Son could also be called the parable of the Loving father or the Parable of the Self-Righteous Elder Brother, who wanted to see his brother punished. He had no welcome for his repentant sibling and even Disowned him, referring to him as "this son of yours"

ON THIS SUNDAY RESOLVE TO BE ANGRY WITH SIN BUT NOT THE SINNER. NEVER CUT PEOPLE OFF BECAUSE THEY DO WRONG, TELL THEM "I DISAGREE WITH YOU, BUT I STILL WELCOME YOU, I STILL LOVE YOU" JESUS ATE WITH SINNERS AND WELCOMED THEM, HE NEVER TURNED ANYONE AWAY; WE NEED TO DO THE SAME.

FORGIVENESS MUST ALWAYS BE ON OFFER, TO BE UNABLE TO FORGIVE SOMEONE IS UNCHRISTIAN. GOD'S LOVE IS PERMANENT, LIKE THE SUN IT IS ALWAYS SHINING. NEVER SAY TO A CHILD, "IF YOU DO THAT GOD WON'T LOVE YOU", GOD NEVER WITHDRAWS HIS LOVE. WE FEEL COLD WHEN WE ENTER THE DARKNESS NOT BECAUSE THE SUN STOPS SHINING BUT BECAUSE THE EARTH IS TURNING AWAY FROM THE SUN. SIN IS TURNING AWAY FROM GOD; HE NEVER TURNS AWAY FROM US. HE IS ALWAYS THERE TO WELCOME US WHEN WE NAME OUR SIN AND COME TO OUR SENSES, AND RETURN TO THE WAY OF TRUTH.

LIKEWISE OUR FORGIVENESS TOWARDS OUR NEIGHBOUR MUST BE PERMANENT SO WE CAN BE RECONCILED AS SOON AS OUR NEIGHBOUR TURNS AROUND.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER THAT FORGIVENESS IS NOT THE SAME AS RECONCILIATION. WE CAN FORGIVE WITHOUT BEING RECONCILED. RECONCILIATION TAKES ACTION FROM BOTH PARTIES, IT CAN ONLY TAKE PLACE WHEN THE OTHER PERSON ACKNOWLEDGES HIS FAULT AND SAYS "SORRY". HE COMES TO HIS SENSES AND SAYS "I WILL LEAVE THIS PLACE AND RETURN."

NEVERTHELESS OUR FORGIVENESS IS ALWAYS ON OFFER: OUR SIDE OF THE RELATIONSHIP IS FULFILLED.

The power of this parable is to invite us to examine those moments in our own lives when we behave like the each of the characters in the parable: sometimes we are the older brother wanting punishment for the sinner – "What's she doing going to communion? Didn't she remarry outside the church?" "Lock him up and throw away the key" "Zero tolerance". Many people are put off coming back to church because of the harsh judgments and criticisms of the self-righteous.

MAY WE NEVER BE THE ELDER SELF-RIGHTEOUS BROTHER BUT ALWAYS THE PRODIGAL: NAME OUR OWN SIN, COME TO OUR SENSES AND RETURN.

WE MUST ALWAYS BE THAT LOVING FATHER: LONGING FOR THE MOMENT OF RETURN AND RECONCILIATION, WITH OUR FORGIVENESS ALWAYS ON OFFER. THEN THE REJOICING, THE FAMILY FEAST FULL OF WELCOME AND LOVE. *Fr James S Doherty*

Education Sunday 2022

Education Sunday is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in this country's liturgical calendar. Established by the Bishops in 1848, originally on the feast of the Sacred Heart in June, it is now celebrated at the beginning of the academic year. Although long associated with the annual collection for the work of the Catholic Education Service, its main purpose is to celebrate the work of Catholic education and to enable it to continue to flourish with the support of the whole Catholic community. The Catholic Church is this country's largest provider of secondary schools and second largest provider of primary schools. Catholic education is by far the largest charitable endeavour of the Church in this country: we give thanks for the many thousands of teachers, lecturers, academics, support staff, leaders, governors, advisers and others who have found their vocation in Catholic education. and without whom this endeavour would be impossible. Catholic schools continue to be true to their mission: they are more diverse than any other type of school; they recruit disproportionately more children from the poorest areas of the country and still consistently manage to be the highest performing schools in the country. For Catholic education to continue to flourish, it needs to rely on the continued support of the whole Catholic community. There will be a collection at all Masses this weekend and if you are able to give, it will be greatly appreciated.
