Almighty God, You are the author and sustainer of all human life, grant that your servant, Elizabeth our queen, to whom you granted a long and happy reign as monarch of these lands may be forgiven her sins and rewarded with that eternal life promised to all those born again in the water of baptism and power of your Holy Spirit. Through Our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit God forever and ever Amen

"The Children of this world are wiser in their generation than the children of light"

We are the children of this world, it is God's world and it is good. It reflects His wisdom and love. He wants us to enjoy it.

We are also children of the light. We follow Christ, the light of the world, who teaches us in the parable of the unjust steward that we need to be as diligent in the things of the spirit as we are the things of the earth. By false accounting the steward has siphoned off his master's money, and feathered his own nest. He has been discovered and knows he will be sacked, so now he wins favour with his master's debtors, falsifying the accounts to their advantage.

If only we were as cunning in things of the kingdom. We take a great amount of planning and energy living as children of the world: be as diligent in the things of God.

This rascal faced a huge crisis, about to be sacked; his response was bold and imaginative. Jesus warns us to: "be as wise as serpents, but as simple as doves"

We face a great crisis of faith in the world, we need to respond and be ready. Catholic teachers must prepare their pupils to be children of this world, and of this generation: well educated in the sciences, the arts and literature, but our pupils are also children of the light, they must be well educated in the things of God: followers of the light of the world: knowing His teaching, and able to defend it to secular society.

This is especially true in the final years at a catholic school, preparation for adult life as citizens of the world and of the Kingdom of Light must be intensified. In their final years they need to study the riches of Catholic Theology.

Indeed all of us; parents, teachers, Priests, members of trade and professional bodies – we are all children of this world and children of the light. We must never betray that light in the way we live and vote, England needs, the world needs, children of light in the corridors of power.

The Catholic Church has no difficulty with the separation of Church and State: Jesus suggested it "give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's" But the separation of Church and State is not the same as separation of faith and life. A just secular society will give public space to faith; the absence of faith in the market place is often not due to aggressive atheism, but to our own weakness.

Many teachers feel that faith has no place in the classroom, they are wrong; whatever your job or vocation is, as children of light we have a duty to reflect that light whatever we do and wherever we go. By living our faith out in public and so building our secular society for the Common good, we need to be good citizens of this world and this generation: but above all the world needs us to be Children of the Light: witnesses to Christ the Light of the World.

We pray every day: "Thy Kingdom Come: Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven", this earth, this generation and done through me.

It is a cause that is bound to succeed: because Christ PROMISED to St Peter and his successors that come hell or high water "the gates of hell CANNOT prevail against His Church" and that He is with us in the struggle until the end of time

Considering Your Vocation

Could God be calling you to Priesthood or Religious Life, or even as a Permanent Deacon? It is important for us to discern our vocation in life through prayer and conversation with others. If you have questions or thoughts, it is also important to speak to your parish priest who will be able to help with this and talk through things with you. Are you an unmarried man whom God may be calling to serve him and the Church? Or a woman called to religious life? Or are you a married man, over 35, who feels called to serve as a permanent deacon in the diocese and ready to service as a deacon in a parish? It could be you that God is calling today. The Church needs you to respond to the call that God makes to us.

Cafod's campaign to "Fix the Food System"

The Third World Group of St. Patrick's, Felling invite parishioners from our Partnership to an information evening, presented by Mark Maughan, Cafod's Community Participation Co-ordinator in the Diocese, who will speak about Cafod's current campaign to "Fix the Food system," and share his experience of time he has recently spent in the Sudan.

All around the world, including here at home, families are finding it harder to put food on the table. In northern Kenya, Ethiopia and South Sudan, four years of drought has resulted in twenty million people fighting for survival. Schools are closed and people are forced to keep moving to find places where food is available. Pope Francis reminds us that as Catholics we are called to care for the world's most vulnerable people; it is our commitment to them that is a mark of our faith.

Mark will be coming to St. Patrick' parish centre, located beneath St. Patrick's Church, Felling on **Thursday, 13th October at 18.30**. We hope you may feel able to join him and fellow parishioners from our Partnership in a Covid safe environment. Please note this is an awareness evening and not a fundraiser!

EXTRA COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND FOR HOME MISSION SUNDAY

Home Mission Sunday the third Sunday in September has been known as 'Home Mission Sunday', but this has now changed to "Evangelii Gaudium Sunday" to better reflect the Holy Father's inspiration, and the work of the Mission Department at the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. We, the Bishops of England and Wales, hope that you will appreciate that the second collection on this Sunday is important in financing the work of the Mission Department, and in enabling the local Church to make the Joy of the Gospel a reality in England and Wales. Over the past two years our emphasis has moved towards supporting diocesan coordinators in their work, as well as carrying out the work directed by the Holy See. Thus, Evangelii Gaudium Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate the beauty of our faith, our liturgy and Church buildings, our dialogue with others in faith, and our proclamation of Christ's saving good news. The work of the Mission Directorate concentrates on evangelisation and catechesis, the beauty of the Liturgy and our church buildings, and sharing the beauty of the Catholic faith with Christian and non-Christians through outreach and dialogue. This work supports the bishops at the national level and helps create greater understanding. The directorate also reaches out to those with no faith, but who seek the Lord "with a sincere heart".
