- Books will be out of circulation for a few days in order for them to be checked before being returned to the shelves
- Some of the books are fairly old and have been well used and marked please do not add any marks yourself
- If, on borrowing a book you find it to be damaged in any way please record this in the record book
- If you have any suitable books with which you have finished and feel someone else may enjoy reading please donate them to the library by placing them in the 'donated books' box

COVID GUIDANCE Updated

The following has been issued by Bishop Robert following guidance given by the Bishop's Conference, full details can be found at:-

COVID-19: guidance for the safe use of places of worship - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

- Hand sanitiser to continue to be used on entering and leaving church and before liturgies.
- Face coverings to be used by all attending Mass. Priests in the sanctuary, providing they are sufficiently distant (2m or more) from the congregation, do not need to wear a face covering except when distributing Holy Communion.
- **Social Distancing and Capacity of Churches** -reduced church capacities based on a minimum of 1M spacing between households should continue.
- **Cleaning** General cleaning to a good standard, using commonly available cleaning fluids and detergents, with attention to frequent touch points is the standard to continue.
 - a) Cleaning high frequency touch points in buildings after each act of worship.

- b) Thoroughly cleaning the church once a week
- Congregational Singing Indoor congregational singing will be permitted. The use of
 cantor groups and other choirs is also permitted, singing should be phased in gently
 as part of worship and face coverings should be worn by members of the
 congregation whilst singing together, until infection levels reduce.
- Hymn books and Mass cards can be reintroduced
- Test, Track and Trace NHS Test, Track and Trace system is no longer in operation and as such the use of QR codes is no longer necessary.
- One-way systems and movement of people It is no longer necessary to have oneway systems or other restrictions on movement in churches.

As Covid cases remain high in our region I would like to continue with good ventilation and ask that the doors to church remain open.
